PROGRAM NOTES

Tarrare aims to capture the specific, surreal kind of loneliness resulting from the need for social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic. Though it was written for distanced performers to record individually, my hope is that it offers a brief moment of togetherness. The piece is named after an 18th century French showman who's unique affliction caused him to eat without ever becoming full and forced him to live a life in isolation.

PERFORMANCE NOTES

The guitar part is written in Drop D tuning (D-A-D-G-B-E) and calls for a set of extended techniques using writing pens and a bass or cello bow.


The first pen gesture requires the player to place a generic plastic pen on the third fret under the A (V) string such that it is held in place with the dull end resting lightly on the higher D string (IV). When notated, the player should lightly hit the protruding end of the pen to create a sustained, metallic chord as the pen bounces against the open D strings. This “pen slap” gesture is notated with x noteheads. For example:



The second gesture asks the player to use a separate pen to “bow” an open string by rubbing the pen perpendicular to the string, in and out of the sound hole. The resulting sound should have a metallic buzzing or sawing quality. This gesture is notated as a tremolo over square noteheads. For example:



Finally, one section of the piece asks the guitarists to use a cello or bass bow to bow the bottom strings in a circular motion. Though similar to the pen bowing technique, this gesture offers a more aggressive timbre. The player may find it helpful to mute the strings with the left hand to improve control. This gesture is notated with a swirling line emerging from triangle noteheads. For example:
